Evaluating a master thesis on a scale from 1 to 10 (with 6 considered sufficient) involves assessing various aspects of the report's quality and rigor. Here are some key factors to consider for assigning a score:

Topic	Note
Document <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Is the thesis clear and well-structured? Are all the mandatory sections present in the document: abstract, introduction, materials and methods, results, discussion or conclusion and recommendations? - Are there appropriate headings and subheadings to guide the reader? - Are figures, tables, and charts clear used effectively to support the text? 	
Theory / research <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Is the methodology appropriate for the research question? - Are potential biases and limitations addressed? - Does the discussion section provide a thorough interpretation of the issue? 	
Bibliography <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Are all sources properly cited? - Is there a comprehensive list of references that includes relevant research? 	
General <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Punctuality and adherence to agreements - Seriousness and reliability
