Study programmes

Guidelines for the organisation and conducting of inter-Faculty examinations or examinations within the framework of inter-Faculty programmes

Art. 1 General principles

All students are subject to the Study Regulations and the specific Guidelines of the Faculty in which they have enrolled and been admitted, without prejudice to the provisions of article 3 of these Guidelines.

Art. 2 Scope

- These Guidelines for the organisation and conducting of inter-Faculty examinations or examinations within the framework of inter-Faculty programmes¹ are applicable to all the students who can and, in any case, are authorised as part of their study plan to take the examinations of other Faculties in USI within the limits provided for in the individual study plan and the applicable *Study Regulations*.
- In the event of doubt, this decision falls in the first instance upon the Examination Board and the Academic Director of the Bachelor's and the Master's programmes for the Academy of Architecture, the Study Delegate for the Faculty of Communication, Culture and Society, the Director of Examinations for the Faculty of Economics, and the Bachelor's or Master's Study Programme Director for the Faculty of Informatics, after consulting if considered necessary the academic director of the Bachelor's and Master's programme of the Faculty to which the student belongs.

Art. 3 Application conditions

- If a student (also on a study abroad programme at USI) is authorised as part of his/her study plan to attend courses in other USI Faculties, he/she is responsible for finding out all the details of these courses beforehand, as well as their structure and the scheduling of the classes, repetition of examinations and assessment methods. In this regard, the *Study Regulations* of the Faculty offering the course and the related examination are applicable.
- With reference to aspects concerning the student's career and administrative aspects regarding enrolment and withdrawal from examinations, limits on the number of attempts permitted for passing an examination, the recognition and validation of assessments and expulsion, the *Study Regulations* of the Faculty in which the student has enrolled shall be applicable.

Art. 4 Further specifications

These *Guidelines* provide indications on the interpretation and application of the *Study Regulations* currently in force, which are to be consulted for all other matters.



Art. 5 Exceptions and complaints

- Any exceptions to these Guidelines are the responsibility of the Pro-Rector for Education and Students' Experience, having consulted the Faculty in question.
- The responsibility for any complaints and appeals is regulated as per the respective Faculty *Study Regulations*.

Art. 6 Effectiveness
