

# Provisions on the use of teaching material by students

## **Art 1. General principles**

- 1 The teaching staff provides the students enrolled in the courses with teaching material as a study tool.
- 2 The teaching material is automatically protected by copyright from the moment it is created, without the need for any formalisation procedure or registration. In this sense, the following are protected: the written paper and digital texts, images, videos, slides and the teacher's own lessons, both in attendance and online.
- 3 In principle, any reproduction of a work protected by copyright requires the explicit authorisation of the rightful owner. By reproduction is intended any copies made through any means such as photocopying, scanning, screenshot, etc.

## **Art 2. Use of teaching material that requires the consent of the owner** (What I can do only upon authorisation)

- 1 Lesson recordings, both in attendance and online, are made available to students. The student who wants to record the lesson autonomously is required to obtain authorisation from the professor.
- 2 Students who wish to use the teaching material for purposes other than exam preparation must obtain explicit authorisation from the professor.

## **Art. 3. Restrictions to the use of teaching material** (What I cannot do)

- 1 It is prohibited to upload and distribute educational material on public online platforms.
- 2 It is forbidden to label the content of other people's educational material as your own.
